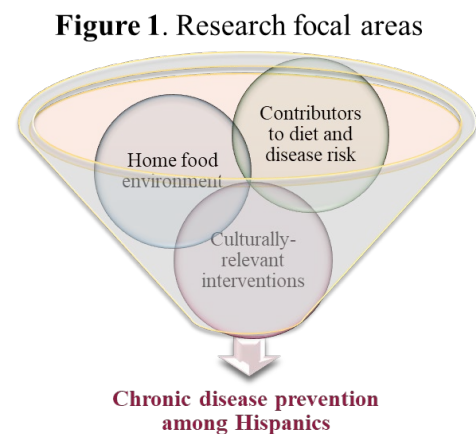

The overarching theme of my portfolio centers around diet and chronic disease prevention among Hispanics, with particular interest in the following main focal areas (illustrated in Figure 1): (1) identifying factors contributing to diet quality and chronic disease risk among Hispanics; (2) assessing the role of the home food environment on dietary behaviors and as an intervention target for diet improvement; and (3) designing, implementing, and evaluating culturally-relevant interventions for chronic disease risk reduction in Hispanic individuals and families.

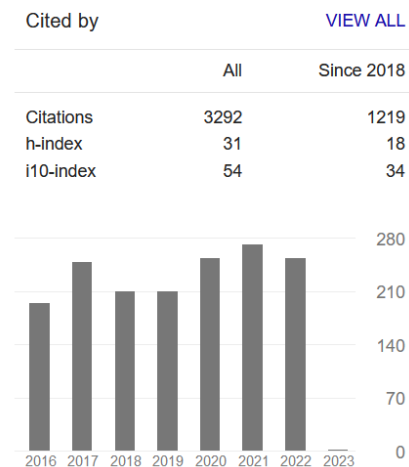

Figure 2 shows my Google Scholar citation indices.

Of note, my work takes place within a niche at the intersection between nutrition, public health, Hispanic/minority health, and social sciences. Therefore, I deliberately publish in a diverse array of journals by discipline, including those that increase visibility and impact of my work related to Hispanic health. As a result, some may have lower IF than traditional nutrition or public health journals, but reach a broader and/or larger target readership.

Notes:

In the nutrition and metabolism field and related areas authors are listed in decreasing order of contribution, with the exception of the last author, and the following considerations apply:

- The first author is usually the person who conducted most of the work AND wrote the main contents of the manuscript.
- The senior author, or principal investigator who secured funding for the work, is usually listed as last author, unless he/she wrote the main manuscript content. This person is usually the corresponding author.
- A student's first authorship reflects that the student conducted an important amount of the work and wrote the manuscript under the corresponding author's mentorship. In this case, the mentor is listed last as senior corresponding author, and the work is recognized as being part of the senior author's body of work.

Exceptions to these authorship considerations are noted with an asterisk (*) and mostly indicate publication in public health or a field other than nutrition/metabolism. In these cases, authorship is listed in decreasing order of contribution.

The 2020 median impact factor for nutrition & dietetics journals was 2.937 and for public, environmental and occupational health journals was 2.104 (source: Journal Citation Reports; accessed April 20, 2021)
