PROFESSIONAL STATEMENT

I am a cultural geographer and critical philosopher of race, space, and power whose work examines how stories shape the racial geographies of the United States and the Americas, especially the enduring structures of anti-Blackness. Across my projects, I am drawn to origins, the quiet beginnings of stories and the borders they grow into, determining who belongs, who is seen, and who is granted legitimacy. I treat stories as maps: they trace boundaries, mark hierarchies, and naturalize racial inequality. Much of my work interrogates the ordinariness of whiteness, asking what narrative and spatial origins made this order seem unquestionable, and what becomes possible when we tell stories otherwise.
