STATEMENT OF RESEARCH INTERESTS:

Dr. Rebecca Lee's work focuses on ameliorating health disparities by applying social justice principles focusing on environmental and policy determinants of physical activity and behavioral nutrition. She conducts translational implementation science research emphasizing innovative, fun interventions and contextual factors to improve health outcomes in communities of color, women and people with disabilities. She is co-creator of the Ecologic Model of Physical Activity. She employs a participatory, transdisciplinary approach to combine theory and techniques drawn from behavioral medicine, community psychology, geography, nursing research, policy science, and social ecology to enhance sustainability of successful, multilevel interventions. Dr. Lee has been consistently federally funded for over 20 years and has over 160 peer reviewed, scientific publications.
