Students learn about the various aspects and thought processes necessary to develop the understanding and develop the skills necessary to produce film and media projects. The course focuses on development of projects, contracts, screenplay breakdowns, scheduling, budgetting and the extensive work required to take a project through principal photography, post-production and marketing and distribution.
