2023-present SHS 582: Differential Diagnosis of Communication Disorders

Completed extensive course revisions. I generated instructional materials for Canvas, recorded new lectures, created new learning activities, and re-organized the Canvas shell. This graduate-level course is required for students in the MS in Communication Disorders program. It uses a flipped classroom model to cover principles and practices related to assessment of communication skills and diagnosis of communication disorders across the life span. Enrollment: 49-55.

2020-present SHS 545: Communication Assessment and Intervention for Hearing Loss

Developed new in-person course. I designed the curriculum, created multi-modal instructional materials, developed learning activities (including multilingual/multicultural case studies), and generated formative and summative assessments. In 2025 I extensively revised this course through the CHS Teaching Academy. This graduate-level course is an elective for students in the MS in Communication Disorders program. It uses a flipped classroom model to cover evidence-based approaches to the assessment of and intervention for speech, auditory, language, literacy, cognitive communication, and social communication skills for individuals who are Deaf or hard of hearing. Enrollment: 10-25.

2019-2022 SHS 573: Language Assessment and Intervention for School-Age Children

Completed extensive course revisions. I created new instructional materials and learning activities, revised student assessments, and revised the Canvas shell. This graduate-level course is required for students in the MS in Communication Disorders program. It uses a flipped classroom model to cover approaches to language intervention for school-age children and professional practices in educational settings. Enrollment: 43-47.

2018-2021 SHS 539: Professional Issues in Speech-Language Pathology

Completed significant expansion/development. I expanded this course from a one-semester online course to a two-semester in-person flipped-format course. I generated instructional materials, created learning activities, identified and scheduled guest presenters, designed formative and summative assessments, and created Canvas shells for both semesters. This course covers professional issues in speech-language pathology to ensure that students meet the professional knowledge requirements specified by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association and to support their skills in communication, ethics, advocacy, and professional practice. Enrollment: 45.

2015-present SHS 524: Counseling in Communication Disorders

Completed extensive course revisions. In 2020, I began collaborating with a faculty colleague in Audiology to team-teach this course. We created new instructional materials, learning activities, lectures, and formative and summative assessments. This elective course introduces graduate student clinicians to culturally relevant and inclusive counseling practices for individuals who have speech, language and hearing disorders, and to techniques for effective self-reflection. The course uses a flipped classroom model to provide students with hands-on practice applying counseling techniques and developing self-awareness skills. Before the AuD program pause, it included both audiology and speech-language pathology graduate students. Enrollment: 33-57.

Clinical Instructor/Mentor

2016-2021 SHS 484: Clinical Internship for Speech-Language Pathology Assistant (SLPA) Program Develop and maintain SLPA clinical training experiences. I collaborated with other speech-language pathology faculty to develop and supervise clinical training experiences for undergraduate students in our Speech-Language Pathology Assistant program. Clinical programs included group and individual therapy for children and adults who wished to improve their articulation, accent, and language skills. This involved creating assessment procedures, developing therapy materials and activities, editing clinical documentation, scheduling weekly debriefing and planning meetings, and conducting regular feedback sessions with students.

2015-present SHS 580: Clinical Practicum - Speech-Language Therapy

Develop and maintain multiple clinical training programs. Since 2015, I have continuously developed new clinical programs to provide graduate students with real-world experience providing speech-language therapy and aural rehabilitation to individuals with communication disorders. This involves designing culturally responsive, inclusive, and evidence-based assessment and intervention protocols for a range of concerns, including developmental language disorder, stuttering, aphasia,

autism, dyslexia, and hearing loss. It also involves marketing the programs, recruiting clients, collaborating with community partners and other practitioners, and developing instructional materials and hands-on clinical experiences for graduate student clinicians. Note: this course does not appear on my teaching schedule until Fall 2017 due to previous differences in workload accounting. Below are brief descriptions of the clinical programs I have developed.

2023-present Dyslexia Evaluations, Lead

Consult with dyslexia researchers and experts to design and implement evidence-based evaluation protocols for literacy concerns. Assess phonological awareness, reading decoding, reading comprehension, spelling, and writing skills for children and adults with suspected dyslexia. Mentor graduate students in planning individualized evaluations, interviewing families, administering assessments, analyzing results, and writing professional reports.

2021-present Hearing Healthcare Assistance Project, Co-lead

Collaborate with audiology faculty and community partners to provide no-cost hearing healthcare services for adult Arizonans with hearing loss who have limited income. Design and create client- and family-friendly instructional materials and hands-on learning activities to promote understanding of hearing loss and effective use of hearing aids, communication strategies, and self-advocacy skills. Write and submit grants to support the program. Mentor graduate student clinicians in their education and training of clients to support sustained use of and benefit from hearing aids.
