- Clinic Director (2004-2018): Responsible for the growing the clinical training program for Doctor of Audiology graduate students and the fiscal management and the growth and development of the Audiology Clinic, including increasing patient flow and volume, expanding clinical services, increasing revenue and profit, and improving information management. Maintained and upgraded clinical equipment and supplies in accordance with budgetary considerations. Raised the level of clinical service provision and expanded the clinic's scope of practice to patrons of our Speech and Hearing Clinic. Developed and implemented clinical

programs that benefitted the student, department, university, and local community. Actively participated in the promotion of clinical services to community groups and professionals. Designed the audiology clinic website for the ASU Speech & Hearing Clinic and wrote comprehensive HIPAA and clinical training manuals for the ASU Speech & Hearing on-campus clinic and clinical rotation/externship sites. Transitioned the clinic to electronic medical records and billing.

- Increased the number of patients seen in the Audiology Clinic from 347 in 2004 to >2000 in 2018.
- Increased the clinic revenue from \$206,842 in 2004 to \$509,329 in 2018.
- Increased fiscal year net profit from -\$78,145 in 2004 to \$170,289 in 2018.
- Audiology Clinician/practitioner (2001 – present): Provide diagnostic and rehabilitative audiological services for adults and children seen through the ASU Speech & Hearing clinic, including comprehensive diagnostic audiological testing, otoacoustic emissions, auditory evoked potentials, hearing instrument and hearing assistive device evaluation and dispensing, BAHA and cochlear implant evaluations and mapping, auditory processing disorder assessments, tinnitus assessments and management, and audiologic rehabilitation.
- Clinical Preceptor (2001 – present): Provide evidenced-based and comprehensive state-of-the-art clinical training and supervision to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> year Doctor of Audiology students in the Department of Speech and Hearing Science. Supervise 4<sup>th</sup>-year audiology extern Au.D. students from other universities. Developed several unique clinical training opportunities for Doctor of Audiology students:
  - 2018 – present
    - *Child Hearing Connections Summer Camp*: With funding from the Arizona Community Foundation (ACF), developed a summer camp for hearing impaired children in summer 2018. This camp provided a wonderful opportunity for children as well as valuable clinical training for AuD and SLP students.
  - 2015 – 2017
    - *Student Health Outreach for Wellness (S.H.O.W.) community initiative project*: Doctor of Audiology students and audiology faculty from the ASU Speech and Hearing Clinic began providing hearing healthcare services on Saturdays as part of the larger S.H.O.W. initiative. Funding from the Arizona Community Foundation made the addition of audiology services to the S.H.O.W. Clinic initiative possible through the purchase of the needed audiology equipment to provide diagnostic and rehabilitative hearing health care. Audiology services are otherwise unavailable to

- this underserved adult homeless population. The availability of Audiology services as part of the S.H.O.W. Clinic was beneficial to those patients served, by addressing their ear and hearing concerns, and to the Doctor of Audiology students, by exposing them to interprofessional education (IPE).
- 2016 – present
    - Established *Super Clinic*, which is an advanced on-campus clinic for 3<sup>rd</sup>-year Au.D. students, designed to foster clinical autonomy and independence. Led a project to research, secure funding, and install a Clinic Observation and Recording Systems (CORS) for the ASU Speech and Hearing Clinic. The CORS system is integral for remote supervision used for Super Clinic.
  - 2010-2017
    - Established *Hearing for Humanity* in 2010 and organized this annual humanitarian effort. Each year a team of graduate students and audiologists conducted a month-long humanitarian mission to Malawi Africa to provide audiological services including training/education, hearing testing, earmold fabrication, and hearing aid fitting and follow-up services. Established the HFH program under the ASU Study Abroad Office as well as a non-profit organization under the ASU Foundation in 2012.
  - 2004 – present
    - With funding from the Arizona Community Foundation, (ACF), developed the course curricula and materials for audiologic rehabilitation programs called *Living WELL with Hearing Loss: Problems & Solutions*, *Cochlear Implant Solutions* and *PAL: Parents Adjusting to Loss*. These rehabilitation programs emphasize the enhancement of knowledge regarding hearing loss, hearing aids, cochlear implants, assistive technology, utilization of effective communication strategies, and improvement of speech reading skills. The popular ASU Living WELL with Hearing Loss program has run continuously since fall 2004. The Cochlear Implant Solutions program started in fall 2009.

    - Established the Naomi Craig Technology and Rehabilitation Center through grant funding obtained through the Arizona Community Foundation (ACF) in 2004 and redesigned and updated the center in 2013 with additional ACF funding. This interactive demonstration center has enabled our Doctor of

Audiology students to be exposed first hand to the importance and benefits of assistive technology and aural rehabilitation.

- Clinical Externship Coordinator (2004-2007): Coordinated the off-campus student clinical rotations and externship placements in audiology, including the establishment of new site affiliations, placement of students, and monitoring student performance.
- Undergraduate Advising Coordinator (2001-2008): Coordinated the undergraduate advising program within the department. Provided direct academic advisement to undergraduate students and supervised graduate student advisors.
- Service and contribution to the growth of the Department of Speech and Hearing Science included program and curriculum development. As co-author of the ASU Doctor of Audiology Degree Proposal (2002-2004) and author of the ABOR Executive Summary, I was instrumental in ensuring that Arizona State University was successful in making the necessary transition from the master's degree to the entry-level AuD or Doctor of Audiology degree. This new degree program was approved by the ABOR in August 2003 and accredited by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association in October 2004. Wrote the AuD student handbook, and the AuD clinic manual; developed the AuD KASA form, curriculum checklist, practicum evaluation worksheet and AuD clock hour summary. These documents were all completed in time for the start of the fall semester with the implementation of the first AuD class in 2004.
