Winner of the Peter Ackerman award at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy for the best doctoral dissertation of the year. Research included 109 original interviews of American and host nation participants that amounted to a total of 121 recorded hours. Approximately two thirds of the interviews were of individuals who had served or were serving in Special Forces assignments, a group that usually loathe to talk to anyone about their experiences except with those who are both trusted and have the appropriate bona fides. In addition, many of the interviewees provided a fair amount of unclassified and declassified primary source documents, little of which currently exists in the public record. The dissertation spans eight chapters, five case studies, and 142,000 words. “Lost in Translation” challenges core orthodoxies and conventional wisdom within the academic community and military. U.S. defense department doctrine holds the importance of language training as sacrosanct to advisory missions, but in most of the case studies advisors did not speak the language of their partners but were still successful in producing effective partners. Academically, principal agent theory dominates the pedagogy of military assistance and advising, positing that the agent, through information asymmetry, can control the outcome of the mission. Yet in each case study, advisors were able to produce anomalies or outliers: units that were effective despite the resistance of the host nation.
