TEACHING EXPERIENCE

Health Communication: Introduces students to the field of health communication and the communibiological perspective. Defines perspectives, influences, and trends on "health" as well as the role communication plays in understanding health, illness, access, and risk. Develops specific skills needed as professionals in the field of health communication and introduces students to development of health campaigns.

Social Science Research Methods: Covers quantitative, qualitative, rhetorical and performance approaches, with an emphasis on quantitative methods. Teaches students how to conduct and critique empirical research, assess appropriate research methods, and design a communication study using social scientific research methods.

Advanced Quantitative Research Methods: Introduces students to a multitude of statistical procedures, graphical representation of data, inferential techniques and analysis of variance. Students use SPSS to analyze large data sets and practice writing results without jargon.

Introduction to Interpersonal Communication: Introduces fundamental concepts related to interpersonal communication and examines them across a variety of interactions such as those with friends, coworkers, family members and romantic partners. Also teaches basic communication skills.

Advanced Interpersonal Communication Theory: Engages students in the latest theories and research in the topic of interpersonal communication. Requires that students engage a particular research topic, consuming research with a critical eye while thinking about relationships creatively and analytically.

Relational Communication: Provides intermediate level examination of communication concepts and processes that occur within the context of close relationships. Focuses on interdisciplinary examination of escalating relationship, maintaining satisfactory relationships, and dealing with relationship challenges.

Persuasion and Social Influence: Provides an overview of the role of persuasion and social influence in communication processes. Examines the attitude-behavior relationship through classic and contemporary social influence theories. Assisted at both the undergraduate course and graduate seminar level.

Dark and Bright Side of Communication: Provides topical examination of the intrapersonal and interpersonal phenomena that can serve to build or destroy close relationships. In particular, phenomena that can be examined from both dark and bright perspectives are discussed. Topics include conflict, hurt, uncertainty, happiness, gratitude, and social support, e.g.

Happiness and Communication: Introduces the concepts, theories and principles that related to constructing happiness and wellbeing. Topics include gratitude, forgiveness, social support, appreciation, social networks and communicative contagion of mood. Interpersonal, organizational and dyadic communication are examined on this topic from psychological, sociology, and communication schools of inquiry.

Nonverbal Communication: Introduces the concepts, theories and principles of nonverbal communication with an emphasis on the role that nonverbal messages lay in the communication process. Course content includes a mix of articles as well as chapters.

Communication Theory: Introduces students to scientific and rhetorical theories through investigation of topics such as interpersonal communication, organizational communication, media, group communication, influence, and cultural communication. Also introduces students to the communication field, teaching students how to read and critique a research article, as well as introducing students to study behaviors that will set them up for success in the communication major.

Organizational Communication in Interdisciplinary Studies: Focused on combining the classical approach to organizational communication with other perspectives and metaphors about the organizational process. Also included application based projects aimed at preparing students for the job market.

Intercultural Communication: Explores issues related to the intercultural communication process, particularly focusing on the role of social, cultural, and historical contexts. Further considered are the implications of studying intercultural communication through social psychological, interpretivist, and critical lenses.

Public Speaking: Introduces students to the fundamentals of oral communication in the roles of speaker and listener. Provides skills essential for students to be effective and appropriate in public address.
